First Aid Providers



St. John Ambulance

We are pleased to welcome St. John Ambulance as the official first aid provider for the OFSAA Boys' AA Soccer Championship. Certified St. John Ambulance volunteers, including Medical First Responders (MFRs) and/or Apprentices, will be present at each competition site for the duration of the event. Each location will be equipped with a Mobile First Aid Post, consisting of either an ambulance unit and/or a dedicated first aid tent, stocked with advanced medical supplies and equipment including AEDs and oxygen. St. John Ambulance personnel will work alongside event staff and emergency services to provide immediate medical response and support as required throughout the championship.

Emergency Response Procedure

In the event of a serious injury or medical emergency:

- Call 911 immediately
- Provide the exact field location listed above
- Notify the Site Convenor and St. John Ambulance personnel
- Designate a staff member to meet and direct EMS upon arrival
- Ensure emergency vehicle access routes remain clear at all times

AED Availability:

AEDs are available through the St. John Ambulance First Aid Posts at each site.

Active weather/Lightning procedure

In the event of lightning or severe weather, play will be suspended immediately and participants/spectators will be directed to designated indoor or sheltered areas as determined by site staff.

Rowan's Law

As mandated by Rowan's Law, every student-athlete, coach and trainer is required to confirm they have reviewed the Concussion Awareness Resource and the OFSAA Concussion Code of Conduct. In order to participate in this event it is mandatory that a confirmation form for each participant be completed and submitted with registration.
