OFSAA Age Classifications for the 2023-24 School Year

OFSAA By-Law 5, Eligibility for Competition, Section 4 - Individuals, subsection (iii), states: "meet the following age requirements"

Senior The individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not yet reached

his/her 19th birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in

which the competition is held.

Junior The individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not yet reached

his/her 15th birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in

which the competition is held.

Novice the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not yet reached

his/her 14th birthday by January 1st prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held. Students may compete in this category for

one year only in Grade 9."

For the **2023-24 school year**, a Novice will be born in 2009 or later and may only compete at OFSAA in the Novice category for one year in Grade 9. A Junior will be born in 2008 or 2009 and a Senior will be born in 2004 or later.
