# OFSAA Executive Director Message



Since the disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, high school sports participation in Ontario has shown a strong and steady rebound. After a sharp drop in activity during school closures and canceled seasons, recent data shows a steady comeback: participation reached a high of over 237,000 student-athletes in 2024-25, up more than 6.5% from the immediate

post-pandemic period. Participation numbers hit strong levels, with increases in traditional sports like track and field, basketball, volleyball, and soccer, as well as in emerging sports such as flag football.

While this uptick in participation signals that students are returning to school sport with enthusiasm, it masks a more complex reality: systemic barriers continue to limit equitable access to these opportunities. Students today face a range of challenges such as physical, financial, social, psychological, and environmental that disproportionately affect their ability to participate in high school sports.

Physical barriers include limited access to safe, well-maintained facilities and equipment. Students in low-resource or urban communities are more likely to attend schools with aging fields, fewer practice spaces, and fewer volunteer coaches, which reduces the quality and limits the number of bona fide sport programs offered. These conditions discourage engagement and heighten risk of injury.

The financial barrier is one of the most pronounced drivers of inequity. School sport has seen an increasing demand to operate under a “pay-to-play” model, where families are responsible for fees, equipment, travel, and tournament costs. Research shows that youth from higher-income families are significantly more likely to participate in sports, while those from low-affluence households experience reduced participation rates due to costs, transportation challenges, and feelings that teams are not welcoming.

These barriers result in inequities that persist even amid rising participation numbers. While schools are fielding more teams and offering expanded opportunities post-pandemic, the benefits of these programs are not equally distributed.

Recently OFSAA has partnered with Coaching Effect Canada and is asking its member schools to participate in a comprehensive research study designed to better understand how barriers affect student participation in high school sports in Ontario. The study will collect data from students to examine how certain barriers influence who is able to participate and who is left out.

By gathering information on participation trends, access to facilities, costs, transportation, and students’ sense of belonging, the OFSAA Advocacy Committee aims to identify patterns of inequity that may exist across different schools and communities. Participation in the study will help create a clearer picture of the challenges students face and provide OFSAA evidence-based insights that can help guide future policies, resource allocation, and support strategies.

Ultimately, OFSAA emphasizes that the findings will be used to help member schools reduce barriers, expand access, and ensure that all students have equitable opportunities to benefit from high school sport. Addressing these inequities will require deliberate strategies and programs that reduce financial burdens and foster inclusive team cultures.

The goal...To advocate for students, teachers, schools and ensure that the reported increase in participation is truly accessible to all students.

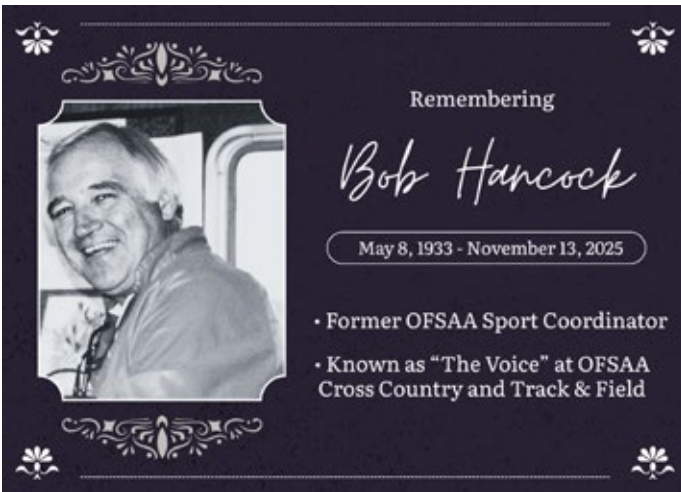

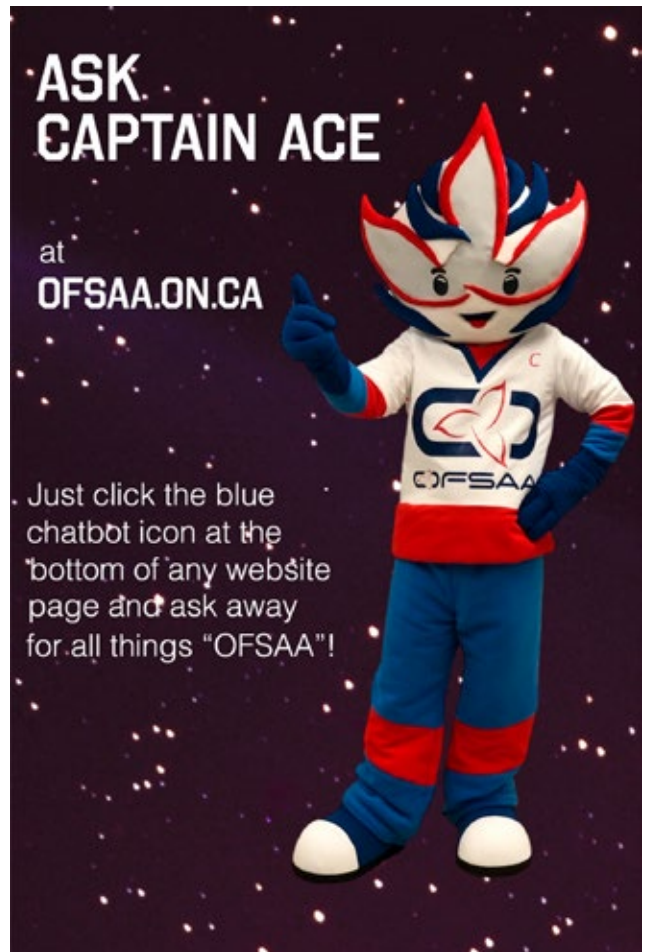


Past and present staff of OFSAA were saddened to learn of the passing of Bob Hancock in Orillia on November 13th.

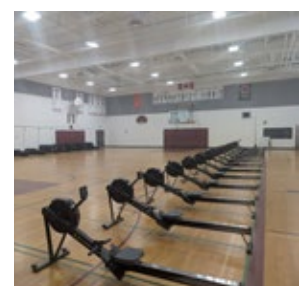

## OFSAA 2025–26: A Historic Run Powered by Determination, Unity, and a Season Played With Purpose

Every basketball season at Walkerton District Community School begins with the same dream: earn a place at OFSAA. For decades, WDCS basketball teams have chased that goal, measuring their growth and ambition against the possibility of competing on the provincial stage. This year, the senior girls didn't just dream it—they earned it. And they did so only months after the tragic loss of pivotal teammate — Olivia Rourke (pictured above) and four other members of their school community in a multi-vehicle crash.

Also killed in the May 2025 crash was Olivia's classmates — Rowan McLeod, 17, Kaydance Ford, 16, and Danika



Baker, 16 — and their teacher, Matt Eckert, 33. The five were returning from a high school softball tournament in Dorchester, Ont., when the car they were in was involved in the accident.

From the early weeks of the season, the team showed a level of commitment and connection that made something special feel possible. But it wasn't just the usual blend of talent and hard work that set them apart. The girls carried with them the weight and tenderness of shared grief—an emotional bond that shaped them, strengthened them, and ultimately brought them closer than any roster could be on paper.

The loss of a beloved teammate changed this group forever. But rather than crumble, the girls formed a unity deeper than most teams ever experience. Practices became spaces of support as much as skill-building. Games became opportunities not just to compete, but to honour. The team wasn't only playing with each other—they were playing for each other, relying on a connection built through moments of vulnerability, reflection, and mutual care.

Throughout the season, the girls wore tape around their wrists marked with Liv's number and the words "For Liv." The tape became a symbol of purpose, a reminder of who they were carrying with them each time they stepped onto the floor. A pillow with Olivia's face travelled with the team as well—a quiet presence on the bench, grounding them



and giving them strength. These gestures were simple, sincere reminders of love and memory that kept the team centred.

As the season progressed, the girls proved that seven players—and often only six—can accomplish extraordinary things when their hearts are fully aligned. They battled through league play with relentless effort and unwavering belief in one another. At CWOSSA, their thin bench became a point of pride rather than disadvantage. They fought through fatigue, adversity, and tough matchups with a focus and competitive fire that made people take notice.

And then came the moment they had worked for.

When the team officially secured its spot at OFSAA, the reaction was unforgettable. Pure joy. Relief. Gratitude. Some players were moved to tears—a flood of emotion that reflected not only the achievement itself, but everything that had brought them to that moment and they had worked for their entire secondary school careers. They had earned their way to the stage every WDCS basketball team dreams about, and they had done it together. They had done it through hard work, resilience, and heart. Coach Vince Yenssen said “Coaching the WDCS senior girls this season was a reminder of the strength that rises from community. Watching them fight their way to OFSAA by playing such great complimentary basketball—each person embracing their role—made our success feel even more meaningful in a year marked by deep loss. They showed that courage and togetherness can turn tragedy into something powerful and unforgettable.”

Arriving at OFSAA, the team felt a wave of excitement and pride that carried them throughout the tournament. Walking into the venue wearing Walkerton colours, seeing their school name on the bracket, and hearing the energy of teams from across the province—it all felt surreal. But it also felt deserved.

They belonged there.

And they proved it, game after game.

Starting point guard Casey Dupuis said “Going to OFSAA meant getting to take our season to the next level. We got to dedicate each game to someone special and play every game with that motivation.”

The girls played some of their best basketball of the season at OFSAA. Their defense was disciplined and aggressive. Their offense was unselfish and fearless. Every loose ball was chased. Every rebound was fought for. Every possession mattered. And behind every huddle, every timeout, every surge of momentum was their shared purpose.

They were playing for their school.

They were playing for their coach, Olivia’s father, Dan Rourke, who returned part way through the season.

And especially—quietly, consistently—they were playing for Liv.

The pillow sat with them on the bench, just as it had at home games. Their wrists were wrapped in the same tape that had carried them through the season. These reminders didn’t

weigh them down; they lifted them up. They reinforced the belief that they were carrying forward a legacy bigger than the scoreboard.

Their run to the quarterfinals—the furthest any Walkerton DCS girls’ basketball team has ever gone—was a testament to their talent, yes, but also to their togetherness. Few teams at OFSAA had a bench as small, or a motivation as powerful. Their performance was built on the foundation of everything they had gone through together: the challenges, the moments of joy, the late-night messages of encouragement, the tears, the laughter, and the unspoken understanding that they were part of something truly meaningful.

Even in the quarterfinal loss, the girls walked off the court with pride. They had competed with everything they had, honoured the person who meant so much to their team culture, and represented Walkerton with dignity, focus, and heart.

Off the court, the memories were just as special. Team meals filled with laughter. The anticipation before games. The sense of being part of something historic for their school. The moments of reflection when they passed by the pillow or looked down at their taped wrists. The joy of simply being together, knowing they had overcome so much to reach that stage.

In the end, the 2025–26 season was not defined only by its achievements—though they were historic. It was defined by unity. By the closeness forged through shared grief. By the determination to honour the past while fighting for the present. By the courage to dream big and the effort to make those dreams real.

The girls of Walkerton DCS made school history this year.

But more importantly, they played with purpose, with love, and with a bond that will stay with them long after the last buzzer.

Their OFSAA journey was more than a tournament run.

It was a tribute, a triumph, and a testament to what a true team can be.

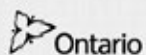

### OFSAA Alumni Scholarship

The OFSAA Alumni Scholarship Program encourages Ontario High School students to apply for the 2025-26 OFSAA Alumni Scholarship. This year, students enrolled in schools in **CWOSSA, GBSSA, NEOAA, NOSSA, SWOSSAA and YRAA** are eligible to apply for the scholarship. Applications must be completed online no later than **April 30th, 2026**.

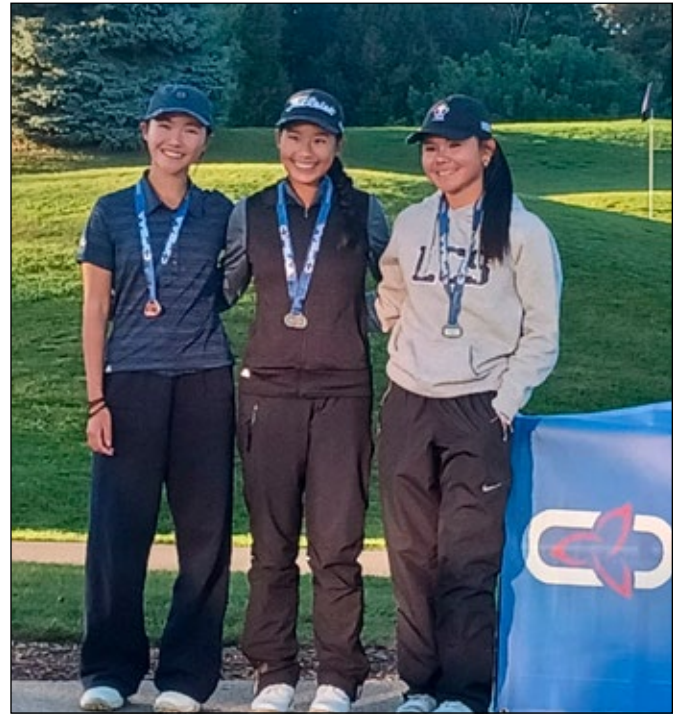
# OFSAA Girls' Golf Festival
