For the **2026-27 school year**, a Novice will be born in 2012 or later and may only compete at OFSAA in the Novice category for one year in Grade 9. A Junior will be born in 2011 or 2012, and a Senior will be born in 2007 or later.

# NEWS FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING

The OFSAA Annual Meeting took place on April 16 and 17, bringing together Association representatives, presidents, principals, and athletic coordinators from across the province.

During the assembly, several motions were voted on, outlined below are some of the key changes to note.

## EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

- For all coeducational championships, festivals and mixed events coordinated by the Federation, an all-boys' school and an all-girls' school may combine for entry.
- In Ultimate, all game discs will be provided to the tournament convenor. Discs will be the official 175-gram mass.

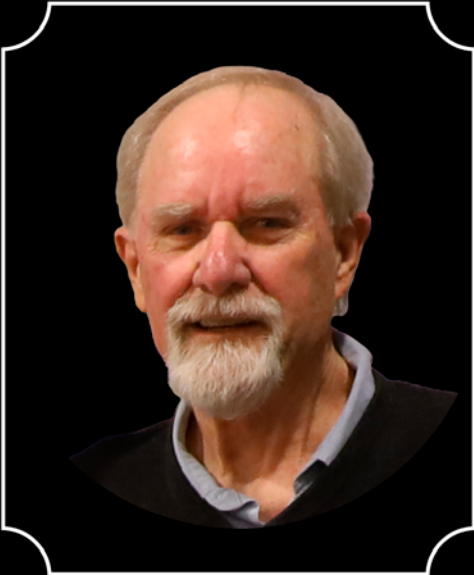
## TO BE ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 1ST, 2026

- Student-athletes who have an IPRC with a developmental disability are permitted to compete in low-risk OFSAA championships until the age of twenty-one (21) and shall be eligible for no more than seven (7) consecutive years from the date of entry in grade nine (9).
- OFSAA "Festival" status has been removed, and all sanctioned events are now considered "Championships".
- Boys' A/AA football has been added to the OFSAA calendar and will take place the week before the scheduled AAA championship.
- For each OFSAA championship, the governing body's rules in effect as of September 1 of each school year will be followed, unless a rule change is required to ensure the safety of student-athletes.



It was encouraging to see how many schools embraced the fitness theme for their Try Day program this year. Many schools used the funds to buy fitness equipment, introduce innovative fitness concepts, add fitness-related activities such as yoga, or conduct a new active sport. 180 schools throughout the

province were approved for the grant. Student-leaders again assisted with the organization and conduct of the Try Day programs. The fitness theme highlighted one of the main aims of the Ministry's initiative for this funding – the value of activity to the health of persons of all ages.

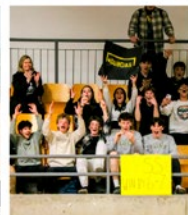

# OFSSAA Regional Events

The philosophy behind Regional Events:

- Priority on participation, not competition

One of our most interesting Regional Events was held this winter in Northern Ontario. Here is an event recap by Nipigon Red Rock DHS teacher and NWOSSAA President Jennifer Huhta.

## Inaugural NWOSSAA Ice Fishing Derby

Over 100 students from eight schools across the region- from Sioux Lookout and Red Lake in the west to Chapleau in the east- took part in the inaugural OFSSAA regional ice fishing derby this March. Schools partnered with the MNR, grassroots programs, and local First Nations to make this event happen.

Nipigon Red Rock, Westgate, and Hammarskjold met in the middle at Pass Lake and spent the day together on the ice (though our only catch was a very small perch). We barbecued, kept a fire going, and made the most of the sunshine when it finally appeared. Hammarskjold and Westgate brought students from their land-based Kendomang Zhagodenamnon (KZ) Lodge program (run through the Thunder Bay Indigenous Friendship Centre and Lakehead District School Board). Teachers shared that this was a meaningful opportunity for their students to take part in a community-building sporting event - many of whom would not typically participate in organized sport.

There was some good-natured grumbling ("Ms. Huhta, there's no fish in this lake!") and plenty of wet boots after a stretch of rain, but also lots of laughter and great food. The dedicated crew in Chapleau made the trip despite a snow day, even though only three students could attend.

Individual prizes went to students from ESC Trillium (smallest fish), ES L'Orée des Bois (largest fish - a 35.5" pike), and Chapleau High School (closest to the random number). The school aggregate banner went to ESC



Trillium, and the league aggregate banner to NSSSAA (North Shore). We look forward to seeing the banners hung in gyms across the region and to expanding the derby across the northern region next winter.

Selecting just two females and two male winners from over 150 submissions is a difficult task, but these four individuals stood out for their commitment to OFSAA's values of leadership, equity, respect and sportsmanship. Each winner will receive a \$500 grant from Baron Rings, a ring and a commemorative plaque to recognize this outstanding achievement.



## KELLY HUANG

Kelly is an exceptional student whose character, achievements, and service reflect the highest standards of leadership, equity, commitment, respect, and personal growth. Through her consistent dedication to academic excellence and community involvement,

she has established herself as a role model within Winston Churchill Collegiate Institute and the wider community.

These experiences required resilience, initiative, and thoughtful leadership, and reflect her dedication to building stronger communities.

### NEILL DAWSON

Neill is a highly driven student-athlete whose high school experience reflects a commitment to leadership, inclusivity, and personal growth. Neill has competed in cross country, rugby, volleyball, track and field, hockey, ultimate frisbee, wrestling, and rugby sevens

over four years at Gloucester High School.

Central to Neill's impact is his "lead from the front" approach to leadership. As a four-year rugby captain at the school, club, and representative levels, he has consistently demonstrated accountability, determination, and the ability to inspire those around him. His leadership reached an international stage when he captained his representative team on tour in Portugal, an experience that reflects both his athletic excellence and his ability to lead under pressure. Sean's list of accomplishments is impressive. In his graduating year, he qualified individually for OFSAA in the 50m butterfly—an achievement that reflects years of perseverance and technical growth. Interestingly enough, Sean also played a pivotal role in forming South Carleton's first-ever boys' swim relay team to compete at OFSAA, demonstrating initiative, leadership, and a deep commitment to expanding opportunities for others.

While his athletic success is significant, it is Sean's leadership that truly sets him apart. As a member of the South Carleton

Athletic Association, he actively promotes school spirit and athletics by refereeing intramurals and managing the school's social media. Behind the scenes, he invests considerable time creating "Featured Student Athlete" profiles and promotional materials that celebrate the diversity and achievements of his peers in an inclusive and respectful way.

Sean's most impactful contribution is the revival of the Nordic Ski Team. Entering high school in Grade 9, he discovered that the program no longer existed. Rather than accept this, Sean took initiative and rebuilt the team from the ground up. Over four years, he cultivated a welcoming and supportive environment, dedicating himself to coaching and mentoring athletes—many of whom had never skied before. Under his leadership, several athletes progressed to qualify for OFSAA, and the senior girls' team achieved collective qualification. Sean's selflessness is evident in how he measures success: not by his own results, but by the growth and accomplishments of his teammates.

His leadership has naturally extended into other sports, where he has been trusted to lead warm-ups and practices for volleyball, track and field, and cross country. Sean's calm, approachable demeanor encourages younger athletes to build confidence and develop strong habits, ensuring his impact will continue beyond his time at the school.

Outside the school community, Sean remains very involved in sport and service. He is an active competitor and mentor with the Kanata Nordic Ski Club, participates in a wide range of community athletics, and volunteers with multiple organizations such as the CityFolk Music Festival and Ottawa Orienteering. A three-time Male Athlete of the Year, Sean exemplifies the values of perseverance, respect, and leadership. 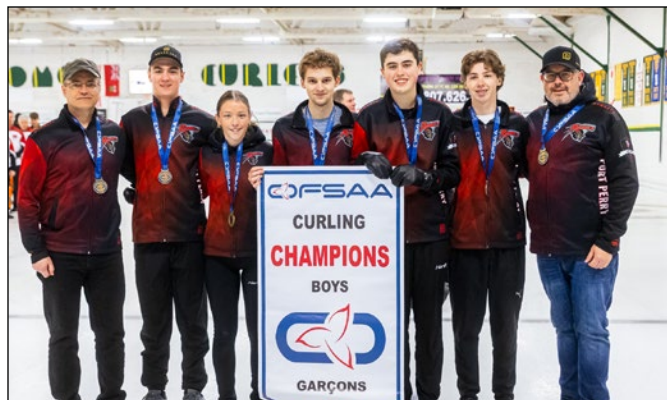

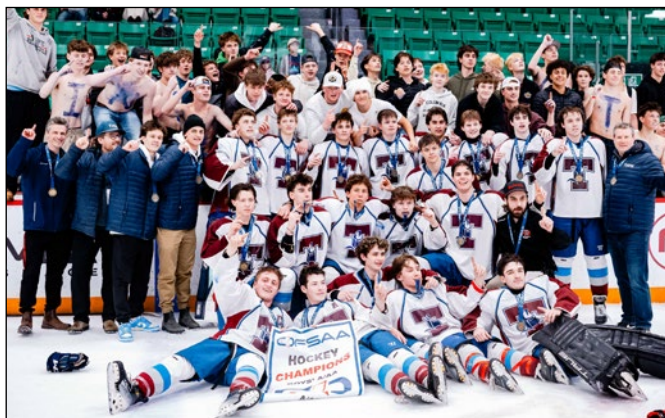

The 2026 OFSAA Boys' A/AA Hockey Championship was convened by Steve Tracze of St. Theresa Catholic Secondary School (COSSA) and the very hard-working volunteers from the school and the community of the friendly city, Belleville.

The championship was held in the beautiful Quinte Sport and Wellness Centre (QSWC) with four ice pads, all under one roof, including the CAA Arena, home of the Belleville Senators of the American Hockey League. The Senators were a very supportive partner and provided their in-game entertainment staff for the championship game, making it a very memorable event for the participants and the fans in attendance.

The quality of play was excellent. The skill level was very high and the competition was intense! High school hockey in Ontario is a terrific product and one that can stand on its own against any other league!

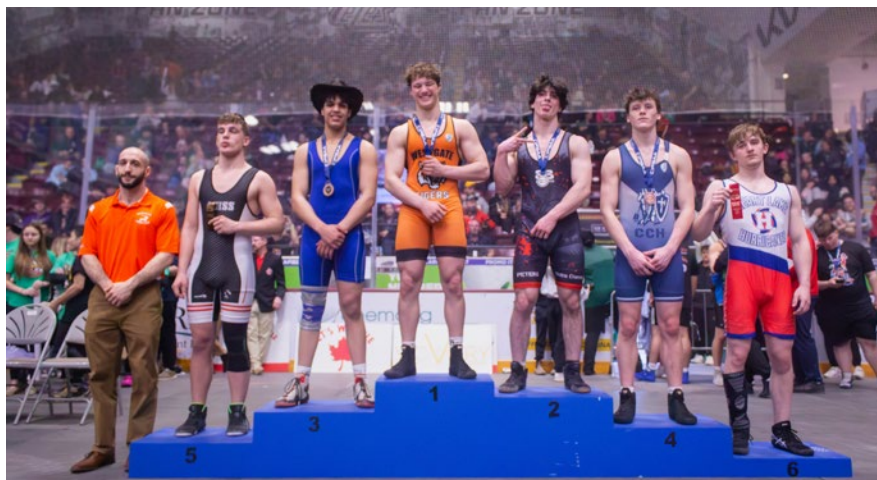

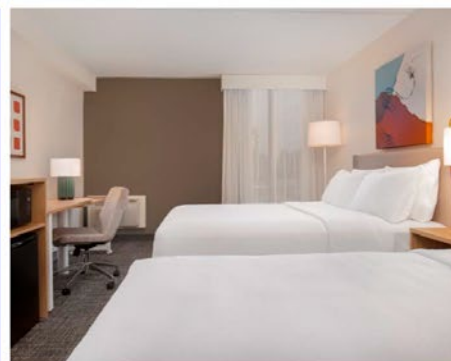
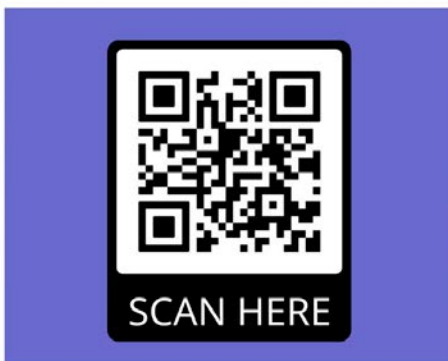
